To mark this year's International Women's Day on March 8, the US State Department celebrated remarkable women from around the world at the 2023 International Women of Courage Awards, hosted by Secretary of State Antony Blinken and First Lady Dr. Jill Biden.

Guests at a post-award reception featured many women ambassadors including (from left) Luxembourg's Nicole Bintner-Bakshian, Linda Thomas-Greenfield, US Ambassador to the UN, Floreta Faber, former Ambassador of Albania, Monaco's Maguy Maccario Doyle, and Canada's Ambassador Kirsten Hillman.

In July the Monaco Boys Choir returned to the USA for an east coast tour from NYC to Florida. They performed free public concerts in churches and cathedrals, at a university, and they sang for the little patients at the Children's National Hospital in Washington, D.C.. Their concert on the Millennium Stage at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts was standing-room only. They are pictured above outside the Kennedy Center (left) and in front of the Kelly Family House (right) in Philadelphia where they attended a private reception.

Under the High Patronage of H.S.H. Prince Albert, and with the generous support of the Monégasque government, throughout July the Monaco Boys Choir (*Les Petits Chanteurs de Monaco*) presented a series of free concerts in New York City, Washington D.C., Savannah, Port St. Lucie, Miami and Fort Lauderdale. The performances were arranged by the Embassy and Consulate General in New York along with Monaco's honorary consuls in Florida and Georgia. This year the Choir celebrated the 49th anniversary of its founding by Prince Rainier, and, as 2023 marks the 100th anniversary of his birth, the Choir dedicated this tour to his memory.

The modern-day version of this award-winning Choir was founded by Prince Rainier in 1974 to showcase Monaco's historic association with culture and the performing arts. It is a part of the Monaco Cathedral Choir and is composed of talented children from ages eight to 18, who traditionally embark on a spring tour of Europe and an international summer tour. The Choir are known for their repertoire of works for children, have visited more than 35 nations and perform an average of 30 to 40 concerts a year. The musical program directed by Pierre Debat, includes works by Charpentier, Mozart, Bach, Mendelssohn, Fauré and Franck; French, Monégasque and English-language songs, and patriotic American anthems.



North American Premiere in Canada of "Rainier par lui-même": a documentary about Rainier III, Prince of Monaco

On November 8, the Embassy of Monaco in Canada, represented by Deputy Chief of Mission Jean-Philippe Bertani, (below right with Vincent Leduc, Cinemania's Board member and Diane Magnoux, Director of Partnerships and Finance) proudly presented the captivating documentary "Rainier par luimême" at the prestigious Cinemania Film Festival in Montréal, considered to be the most important French-language film festival in North America.

In its North American premiere, this remarkable documentary offers an intimate and insightful portrait of Rainier III, the beloved Prince of Monaco. Directed by the talented Monegasque filmmaker Yann Anthony Noghes, "Rainier par lui-même" delves into the life, achievements, and lasting legacy of this iconic figure who played a pivotal role in shaping the Principality. Through rare archival footage and interviews with the Prince and key figures from that time, the film provides a captivating narrative that sheds light on the Prince's multifaceted persona. Audiences at the Festival learned about his enormous contributions to Monaco's cultural, social, and economic development, and his profound influence on the Principality during his 56-year reign.

As this year also marks the 100th anniversary of his birth, the Embassy was honored to bring this film to the Cinemania Francophonie Festival.

Known for celebrating the richness and diversity of French-language cinema, the Festival presents a vibrant showcase of Francophone culture each year, featuring a curated selection of thoughtprovoking films from around the world.

The "G20" of gastronomy, le Club des Chefs des Chefs (CCC), under the presidency of Monaco's Chef Christian Garcia and the vice presidency of the UK's Mark Flanagan (right), held their 46th annual summit in Washington, D.C. in early November. It's the world's most exclusive club: All members must be Chef to their nation's head of state or government.

On their first day in D.C., the chefs from more than 20 nations volunteered at DC Central Kitchen, prepping meals for local charities (center right). They were invited to the White House for lunch, followed by an evening reception hosted by French Ambassador Laurent Bili and Mrs. Sabine Bili-Raczy at the Ambassador's Residence (below right).

The event attracted more than 300 guests and honored US representatives of the French gourmet food industry and included local chefs and food industry leaders. The beverages, products and dishes offered were provided and/or prepared by these professionals. Also on offer was a selection of cocktails supplied by La Distillerie de Monaco.

The Club also visited many D.C.-area sites (Monticello, the Pentagon), were hosted for an Ambassador's lunch with diplomats from the Embassy of their home nations at the Willard Intercontinental Hotel, and were feted at a beautiful reception hosted by the Italian Ambassador Mariangela Zappia. They were farewelled by Cuisine Solutions founder, Stanislaus Vilgrain and his wife, Maggie, at their residence.

The CCC, founded in 1977 by Gilles Bragard, provides members with a place where chefs can exchange ideas and showcase their culinary talents. This year's president is Chef to HSH Prince Albert II of Monaco, Christian Garcia, and vice president is Mark Flanagan, Chef to HM King Charles III.



The Government of Monaco and the Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation was represented at this year's Our Ocean forum in March by Ambassador Maguy Maccario Doyle, who serves as the vice president of the Foundation's US chapter.

Under the theme, Our Ocean Our Connection, Panama's President Nito Cortizo opened the forum and asked governments to discuss historic actions for the global ocean crisis. Panama was the first Central American nation to host the event underscoring its invaluable contributions to marine conservation and global ocean leadership in recent years. Panama is one of the first countries in the world that protects 30% of its territorial waters. The 2024 forum will be held in Greece.

Speaking of Panama...this year marked the 100th anniversary of Barro Colorado Island, the world's oldest continuously studied tropical forest. Administered by the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute.

A Princely Visit to NYC for Monaco's 30th Anniversary of UN Membership

This was a milestone year for Monaco at the United Nations. To mark its 30th anniversary as a UN member nation, since May 28, 1993, HSH Prince Albert (below left with UN Secretary-General António Guterres) took part in the festivities in New York in June along with Princess Stéphanie and her daughter Camille Gottlieb, as part of the Prince Rainier III centennial events.

The Prince also met the President of the 77th session of the UNGA, Hungarian diplomat Csaba Kőrösi to discuss issues including the environment and women's rights. Accompanying Prince Albert was his Minister for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation Isabelle Berro-Amadei as well as his Caribinieri Orchestra, which performed a rousing concert under the baton of Major Olivier Dréan at a reception in the UN building arranged by Monaco's UN Ambassador Isabelle Picco (pictured below right with members of the band).







During the general debate of the UNGA's 78th session, at which 153 Heads of State and Government took part, H.S.H. Prince Albert underlined the importance of respect for the environment, particularly the oceans, and for human rights, and the potential offered by AI, which he stressed the development of which must be controlled.

Among other events during UN-week, Monaco, as a member of the "Coalition to End Plastic Pollution", took part in a meeting where participants renewed their commitment to develop an international legally binding instrument by the end of 2024.

As a continuation of its collaboration with "The Ocean Race," the Permanent Mission of Monaco also hosted a workshop on the concept of "Ocean Rights".
